**Subject for discussion; # 2.**

**FACT: Grand Jury & Access**

The People are blocked from providing evidence of alleged crimes to the Grand Jury of Kennebec County (at least). We have evidence of crimes committed in the State Capitol. We have sworn Affidavits, exhibits, and even a Criminal Complaint prepared, but have been denied access to provide this material to the Kennebec Co. Grand Jury.

**HISTORY**

On March 28, 2013, I, Wayne Leach, approached the Attorney General's office to ask them to get it to the Jury, and was told I needed to go to the Clerk of Superior Court. I did, and asked for the identity of one or more of the grand jurors so I could pass the material to them directly, but was told their identity was secret, and to go to the District Attorney. I took a sealed package, which was marked CONFIDENTIAL and was addressed to the Kennebec County Grand Jury, containing the above mentioned materials to the D. A., and they said they would take a look at it, and that I should hear back from them within a week. The following day, March 29, I mailed a follow-up letter addressed to Meaghan Maloney, the D. A. to be certain she knew the package was there (being a little suspicious of "staff members").
